Students achieving NCEA Level 1 – 82.6% Students achieving NCEA Level 2 – 86.8% Students achieving NCEA Level 3 – 60% Level 1 Literacy – 94% Level 1 Numeracy – 74%



MATHEMATICS DEPARTMENT

The ASDAH Mathematics Department would like to welcome all students, families and caregivers into math's learning 2017. Throughout the year there will be various activities and initiatives both in and out of the classroom that will improve student motivation and learning in Mathematics. This will include participation in Maths and the Australian Maths Competition.

Results from last year include an increase in Numeracy at Level 1 as well as outstanding achievement from two students Siosifa Lua, Merit endorsement at Level 1 and Feao Takitaki Merit endorsement at Level 2.

This year in the junior school students at year 10 will be sitting two Level 1 NCEA achievement standards. You should have received a notice with the dates for these assessments. At both years 9 and 10 all students should have a workbook, these cost \$25 and payment can be made at the school office.

In the senior school all classes are well into their learning with several courses doing assessments over the next 2-3 weeks. All senior students have course outlines detailing the dates of respective assessments. In the senior school students will be issued with several workbooks at a cost of \$30 for the year.

In the Level 1 Mat1, Level 2 Mat1 and Level 3 Mat1 courses graphics calculators are required. These are available from the school for \$80, significantly less than the retail price.

Finally, homework. All students have set homework in maths, the amount of which depends on at what level they are studying. In the senior school it is particularly important that homework is completed. Families, caregivers must allocate time and resources at home for students to achieve this.




The Art Department is down to business and the first works for the Level 1 folios are nearing completion.

Year 9 are producing works based around the theme of growth and the Level 2/3 senior students are looking at the works of various artists as sources of inspiration and direction.


