BRASS BAND




ASDAH BRASS BAND

SCIENCE CLUB




We at ASDAH run a Science club! Our Goals are:

Make sure your child has **signed up** so they won't **miss out** on this ongoing adventure!




SCIENCE DEPARTMENT

ADRA DRIVER LICENCE SCHOLARSHIP

They have earned:

- Free download of the Practical Restricted Licence APP.
- Free AA Membership includes 3 professional driving lessons (under ignition youth program).
- Restricted Licence test fee paid.

These seven students will then have until the 17 November to sit the official Restricted licence test.

Students who pass their restricted driving license test will then be eligible to receive:

♦ Defensive Driving course paid. (This will cut down the time required to get a full licence) Students will have until the **20th December** to complete it.

The remaining three students have until the **14 April 2019** to pass their Learners Licence. If your child is one of the remaining three please ensure that they have sat their Learner Licence by April 14th. There were a lot of students who were disappointed to miss out on this opportunity.

CAREERS

LEARNER LICENCE CLASSES:

There will be other Learner Licence classes in Terms 2, 3 & 4. Please see Ms Duckett for dates.



Classes run after school in the library from 3.30 - 4.30. Ms Duckett will be teaching the class. The cost is \$94 (the cost of the test).



We are lucky enough to have sponsorship for 15 students (leftover from 2018) who will receive a \$50 refund paid into a bank account when they present their Learner Licence to Ms Duckett.

Students need to see Ms Duckett to enrol for these classes.



If for some reason your child is unable to attend our Learner Classes, Behind the Wheel are offering free classes in Mangere too. They also provide help with Restricted and Full Licences. Make sure you mention ASDAH when you contact them.



RESTRICTED DRIVER LICENCE:

At this stage, ASDAH does not offer a Restricted Licence programme.

Auckland Transport Restricted Driver Licence Workshops.

Attend a free 3 hour workshop plus receive a free practical driving assessment (valued at \$80) to see if you are ready to sit the test.



To apply for our restricted workshops you must have held your learner licence for at least 6 months.


